The National Cancer Institute (NCI), The Laboratory of Pathology (LP) at the National Cancer Institute (NCI) is an integral component of the research and clinical community at the National Institutes of Health (NIH). Our goal is to be a globally recognized center of excellence in disease research, clinical diagnostics, and pathology education. The mission of the Laboratory of Pathology is to achieve the highest level of quality in research, diagnostics, and education.

The primary objective is to upgrade existing Government-owned BD FACSLyric 10-color Flow Cytometer to a 12-color Flow Cytometer to expand capacity of multi-immunophenotypic needs for the clinical protocol patient services provided by the Clinical Flow Cytometry clinical service in the Laboratory of Pathology, CCR, NCI.

The National Cancer Institute Plans to purchase LP Flow Cytometry BD FACSLyric Upgrade Kit (10- to 12-color) from BD Biosciences. This is not a request for competitive quotation. However, if any interested party believes it can meet the attached requirements, it may submit a statement of capabilities. The capability statement must be in writing and must contain information and material in sufficient detail to allow NCI to determine is the party can fully meet this requirement. The capability statement must be received in the contracting office by 11:30 AM on June 13, 2022. ET. A determination by the Government not to compete this requirement based upon responses to this notice is solely within the discretion of the Government. Information received will be considered solely for the purpose of determining whether to conduct a competitive procurement.

Sole Source Justification:

Market Research was performed indicating: no other upgrade for the BD FACSLyric flow cytometer to convert from 10-color to 12-color is offered by other vendors and/or contractors in the marketplace that can satisfy the proposed salient characteristic requirements (see attached 'Brand Name and Salient Characteristics' especially the proprietary fit for Government-owned BD FACSLyric flow cytometer) as determined by searches on the internet; review of scientific journal articles and advertisements; and technical/scientific knowledge of products in the market place; 2) no other manufacturer can provide proprietary fit for Government-owned equipment BD FACSLyric flow cytometer; 3) no other organizations in the marketplace are capable of providing the required items (other than the suggested source for the Government-owned model FACSLyric 10-color flow cytometer, see attached Brand Name and Salient Characteristics); and 4) no other small business vendors were identified that can provide an independent quote for the required items.

- d. This acquisition is being pursued to upgrade existing Government-owned BD FACSLyric 10-color Flow Cytometer to a 12-color Flow Cytometer to expand capacity of multi-immunophenotypic needs for the clinical protocol patient services provided by the Clinical Flow Cytometry clinical service in the Laboratory of Pathology, CCR, NCI.

The mission of the Laboratory of Pathology (LP) Department is to investigate the biology and genetics of cancer and other diseases, develop and apply leading edge technologies to diagnostic pathology, and provide collaborative support for clinical research protocols.

The existing Government-owned BD FACSLyric Flow Cytometer system was purchased in 2019 as a 10-color instrument because the more costly 12-color system provided little added benefit due to the limited availability of 12-color products on the market.

However, as the availability of commercial, off-the-shelf products has expanded into the 12-color range and the advent of novel immunotherapeutic regimens has increased the need for multi-dimensional immunophenotyping, an existing 10-color system was expanded to meet the needs of clinical protocol patient specimens with increasingly complex antigenic signatures resulting from new protocols.

Acquisition of a second BD FACSLyric Upgrade kit for this BD FACSLyric Flow Cytometer, rather than an entirely new 12-color flow cytometer system, is a fiscally responsible option to provide increased capacity and to serve as a backup for clinical

testing continuity during episodes of emergency repair for the upgraded flow cytometer as required for certification by JCAHO, CLIA and CAP.

The Upgrade Kit provides two novel fluorescent parameter capabilities via new photomultiplier tubes (PMTs), one each of BD Horizon™ BV711 and BD Horizon™ BV786 to convert the existing 10-color configuration (4-3-3) of the Class I solid state 3-laser system (488 nm, 640 nm, 405 nm) to a new 12-color configuration (4-3-5) to provide exponential expansion of population comparisons and subtle distinction between populations undergoing novel therapeutic regimens. This increased capacity to meet the expanding needs to identify abnormal vs. normal cells allows more reproducible and robust identification of individual populations with predefined groups of abnormal samples to quickly determine possible disease types as well as .

These key features are vital advances in the field of flow cytometry and are needed to provide the Government with the best ongoing analysis of clinical protocol patient specimens for detection of trends and comparison of subtle therapeutic changes at a time when immunotherapy creates ever increasing complexity in patient presentation.

3.0 TYPE OF ORDER

This is a Firm Fixed-Price Purchase Order.

4.0 SPECIAL ORDER REQUIREMENTS

4.1 PRODUCT FEATURES/SALIENT CHARACTERISTICS

The following advanced flow cytometry analysis features/characteristics are required for this requirement:

- a. Proprietary Fit: Only proposed Upgrade Kit components (part no. 662858), provided by the original manufacturer Becton, Dickinson and Company, will fit the sockets built into the existing Government-owned equipment, model FACSLyric Flow Cytometer, SN Z662878000154. No other manufacturers' kit or third party PMT components will fit the PMT outlets to convert the 3-laser, FACSLyric 10-color (4-3-3) configuration to a 12-color (4-3-5) configuration.
- a. Manufacturer's recommendations: Only the proposed Upgrade Kit (part no. 662858 supplied by the original BD FACSLyric manufacturer) is recommended by the manufacturer to maintain clinical patient certification e.g. JCAHO, CLIA, CAP.
- b. Compatibility with the existing Government-owned 12-color BD FACSLyric FACSLyric flow cytometer, SNZ662878000154, to provide matched capabilities for continued clinical patient testing during periods of repair to either instrument.
- b. Manufacturer-trained personnel: Only BD-trained engineers with 2-years' experience on BD FACSLyric flow cytometers are qualified for installation/alignment/testing and customer service support of the Upgrade Kit.

- c. Brand new condition: Upgrade Kit (Becton, Dickinson and Company, manufacturer part no. 662858). Kit or components in used, refurbished, resealed or unsealed condition are unacceptable.
- d. Upgrade Kit must include two (2) new photomultiplier tubes (PMTs) specifically, one each of BD Horizon™ BV711 and BD Horizon™ BV786 to convert the existing 10-color configuration (4-3-3) of the Class I solid state 3-laser system (488 nm, 640 nm, 405 nm) to a new 12-color configuration (4-3-5).
- e. All parts will be manufacturer-recommended to maintain clinical patient testing compliance requirements after the upgrade kit installation e.g. JCAHO, CLIA, CAP certifications.
Example: Installation of a third-party kit or components is not acceptable without written recommendation of each installed alternate component by Becton, Dickinson and Company.
- f. Installation, alignment and testing of all kit components by BD-trained engineers with manufacturer-training and at least 2 years' experience with BD FACSLyric 3-laser flow cytometers (4-3-3 and 4-3-5 configurations), according to recommendations by the original manufacturer (Becton, Dickinson and Company).

4.3 TRAINING

- a. Installation by BD Bioscience engineers with manufacturer-training and at least 2 years' experience with BD FACSLyric 3-laser flow cytometers (4-3-3 and 4-3-5 configurations).
- b. Customer support will be provided by BD Bioscience-trained personnel via customer service calls as needed. Upgrade will not require additional onsite customer training.

5.0 PAYMENT

Payment shall be made immediately upon delivery and satisfactory installation and performance testing of each Upgrade Kit component (both PMTs). Payment authorization requires submission and approval of invoices to the COR and NIH OFM, in accordance with the payment provisions listed below:

II. INVOICE PAYMENT

The Government must exercise its postacceptance rights-

(1) Within a reasonable period of time after the defect was discovered or should have been discovered; and

(2) Before any substantial change occurs in the condition of the item, unless the change is due to the defect in the item.

(e) *Excusable delays.* The Contractor shall be liable for default unless nonperformance is caused by an occurrence beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor and without its fault or negligence, such as acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, unusually severe weather, and delays of common carriers. The Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing as soon as it is reasonably possible after the commencement of any excusable delay, setting forth the full particulars in connection therewith, shall remedy such occurrence with all reasonable dispatch, and shall promptly give written notice to the Contracting Officer of the cessation of such occurrence.

(f) *Termination for the Government's convenience.* The Government reserves the right to terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for its sole convenience. In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall immediately stop all work hereunder and shall immediately cause any and all of its suppliers and subcontractors to cease work. Subject to the terms of this contract, the Contractor shall be paid a percentage of the contract price reflecting the percentage of the work performed prior to the notice of termination, plus reasonable charges that the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government, using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred that reasonably could have been avoided.

(g) *Termination for cause.* The Government may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the Contractor, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the Government, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the Government shall not be liable to the Contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the Contractor shall be liable to the Government for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the Government improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.

The following clause is applicable to all Purchase Orders, Task or Delivery Orders, and Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA) Calls: **Prompt Payment (Jul 2013) FAR 52.232-25**. Highlights of this clause and NIH implementation requirements follow:

I Invoice Requirements

- A. An invoice is the Contractor's bill or written request for payment under the contract for supplies delivered or services performed. A proper invoice is an "Original" which must include the items listed in subdivisions 1 through 12, below, in addition to the requirements of FAR 32.9. If the invoice does not comply with these requirements, the Contractor will be notified of the defect within 7 days after the date the designated billing office received the invoice (3 days for meat, meat food products, or fish, and 5 days for perishable agricultural commodities, dairy products, edible fats or oils) with a statement of the reasons why it is not a proper invoice. (See exceptions under II., below.) Untimely notification will be taken into account in the computation of any interest penalty owed the Contractor.
1. Vendor/Contractor: Name, Address, Point of Contact for the invoice (Name, title, telephone number, e-mail and mailing address of point of contact).
 2. Remit-to address (Name and complete mailing address to send payment).
 3. Remittance name must match exactly with name on original order/contract. If the Remittance name differs from the Legal Business Name, then both names must appear on the invoice.
 4. Invoice date.
 5. Unique invoice #s for all invoices per vendor regardless of site.
 6. NBS document number formats must be included for awards created in the NBS: Contract Number; Purchase Order Number; Task or Delivery Order Number and Source Award Number (e.g., Indefinite Delivery Contract number; General Services Administration number); or, BPA Call Number and BPA Parent Award Number.
 7. Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) or DUNS + 4 as registered in the Central Contractor Registration (CCR).
 8. Federal Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN). In those exceptional cases where a contractor does not have a DUNS number or TIN, a Vendor Identification Number (VIN) must be referenced on the invoice. The VIN is the number that appears after the contractor's name on the face page of the award document.
 9. Identify that payment is to be made using a three-way match.
 10. Description of supplies/services **that match** the description on the award, by line billed.*
 11. Freight or delivery charge must be billed as shown on the award. If it is included in the item price do not bill it separately. If identified in the award as a separate line item, it must be billed separately.

- B. Shipping costs will be reimbursed only if authorized by the Contract/Purchase Order. If authorized, shipping costs must be itemized. Where shipping costs exceed \$100, the invoice must be supported by a bill of lading or a paid carrier's receipt.

In order to facilitate the prompt payment of invoices, it is recommended that the vendor submit a photocopy of the invoice to the "Consignee" designated for the acquisition in blocks 6A – 6E of the face page of the Order/Award document.

II. Invoice Payment

- A. Except as indicated in paragraph B., below, the due date for making invoice payments by the designated payment office shall be the later of the following two events:
1. The 30th day after the designated billing office has received a proper invoice.
 2. The 30th day after Government acceptance of supplies delivered or services performed.
- B. The due date for making invoice payments for meat and meat food products, perishable agricultural commodities, dairy products, and edible fats or oils, shall be in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act, as amended.

III. Interest Penalties

- A. An interest penalty shall be paid automatically, if payment is not made by the due date and the conditions listed below are met, if applicable.
1. A proper invoice was received by the designated billing office.
 2. A receiving report or other Government documentation authorizing payment was processed and there was no disagreement over quantity, quality, or contractor compliance with an term or condition.
 3. In the case of a final invoice for any balance of funds due the contractor for supplies delivered or services performed, the amount was not subject to further settlement actions between the Government and the Contractor.
- B. Determination of interest and penalties due will be made in accordance with the provisions of the Prompt Payment Act, as amended, the Contract Disputes Act, and regulations issued by the Office of Management and Budget.

IV. PROVIDING ACCELERATED PAYMENT TO SMALL BUSINESS SUBCONTRACTORS, FAR 52.232-40 (December 2013)

- a. Upon receipt of accelerated payments from the Government, the Contractor shall make accelerated payments to its small business subcontractors under this contract, to the maximum extent practicable and prior to when such payment is otherwise required under the applicable contract or subcontract, after receipt of a proper invoice and all other required documentation from the small business subcontractor.

- b. The acceleration of payments under this clause does not provide any new rights under the prompt Payment Act.
