Subject: NCI Bid Board Posting – Mouse Pericyte Spatial Transcriptomics Data Analysis

The Center for Cancer Research (CCR) at the National Cancer Institute (NCI) requires a comprehensive data analysis for optimizing segmentation, phenotyping, classifying, identifying spatial location, comparing populations, and determining unique transcriptomics identifiers of lung pericyte cells from tumor-naïve and tumor-bearing wild-type and KLF4 gene knockout mice.

As part of the National Cancer Institute's Center for Cancer Research, the Murgai lab requires downstream analysis of spatial transcriptomics/Molecular Cartography data collected by Resolve Biosciences. This will allow the lab to optimize segmentation, phenotype, classify, identify spatial location, compare populations, and determine unique transcriptomics identifiers of lung pericyte cells from tumor-naïve and tumor-bearing wild-type and KLF4 gene knockout mice. Ultimately, the analyzed data will provide insight as to whether the KLF4 gene has any importance in the metastatic role of pericyte cells.

To perform this work, the NCI plans to purchase this service request from Omapix Inc., Stanford, CA. This is not a request for a competitive quotation. However, if any interested party believes it can meet the attached requirements, it may submit a statement of capabilities. The capability statement must be in writing and must contain information and material in sufficient detail to allow NCI to determine if the party can fully meet this requirement. The capability statement must be received in the contracting office by 11:30 AM on February 17, 2024 ET. A determination by the Government not to compete with this requirement based upon responses to this notice is solely within its discretion. Information received will be considered exclusively to determine whether to conduct a competitive procurement.

STATEMENT OF NEED (SON)

1.0 TITLE

Purchase of data analysis services for the Murgai lab to analyze spatial transcriptomics/Molecular Cartography data collected by Resolve Biosciences.

2.0 BACKGROUND

The Center for Cancer Research (CCR) at the National Cancer Institute (NCI) requires a comprehensive data analysis for optimizing segmentation, phenotyping, classifying, identifying spatial location, comparing populations, and determining unique transcriptomics identifiers of lung pericyte cells from tumor-naïve and tumor-bearing wild-type and KLF4 gene knockout mice.

3.0 TYPE OF ORDER

This is a Firm Fixed-Price Purchase Order.

4.0 SPECIAL ORDER REQUIREMENTS

4.1 PRODUCT FEATURES/SALIENT CHARACTERISTICS

The following salient characteristics are applicable to this acquisition:

- Analysis shall optimize a pipeline for spatial transcriptomics and Molecular Cartography data collected from the Resolve Biosciences platform.
- The pipeline shall perform cell segmentation and detection of the data.
- The pipeline shall segment all data provided for multiple sample types.
- The pipeline shall normalize cell counts for all data provided.
- The pipeline shall phenotype all cells for all data provided.
- The pipeline shall perform spatial and differential analysis for all samples provided.

4.2 DELIVERY / INSTALLATION

The deliverables will be accomplished in a well-structured two-month project. The work packages will be divided into four phases. The details are as follows:

Phase 1 - Method Selection: This will include testing different segmentation pipelines: QuPath cell detection (watershed pixel -based classification), Cellpose and StarDist (machine-learning pixel-based classification) and Baysor (transcript coordinates-based classification). We will iteratively optimize the pipelines to maximize detection of all cell populations in a representative sample chosen. The best-performing method will be chosen based on customer feedback, expected cell sizes and matching image and transcript cloud information.

Timelines ~ 2 weeks

Phase 2-Segmentation execution: In this phase, we will execute the selected segmentation algorithm for all samples and fine-tune settings to maximize consistency between samples (e.g. differences in morphology or staining intensity). We will generate cell boundary files, meta

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information on segmented cells (e.g. centroids, area) and gene-by-cell matrices for visualization and downstream analysis in an R environment.

Timelines: 2 weeks

Phase 3-counts normalization and cell Phenotyping: Raw counts will be normalized using Sctransform as it is the normalization method most suitable for Molecular Cartography datasets. Cell phenotyping will be aided by automatic clustering strategies such as SCINA or CELESTA. To this end, the Murai lab will provide a gene panel annotation to identify which markers genes are expressed by which cell types. The panel can be as simple as providing a list of markers per expected cell type or describe cell-types and sub- types following CELESTA guidelines for panel annotation. Timelines: 1 week

Phase 4-Spatial & DE Analysis: We will identify changes in transcript signatures in pericytes between conditions and generate cell-cell interaction networks of pericytes with all other cell-clusters in each condition with a focus on distances to blood vessels. Different databases will be queried to correctly annotate cell- and molecule-level interactions identified and to assess consistency of the extracted information.

Timelines: 2 weeks

4.3 TRAINING

5.0 PAYMENT

Subject to the terms of this contract, the Contractor shall be paid a percentage of the contract price reflecting the percentage of the work performed prior to the

notice of termination, plus reasonable charges that the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government, using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred that reasonably could have been avoided.

(g) *Termination for cause.* The Government may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the Contractor, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the Government, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the Government shall not be liable to the Contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the Contractor shall be liable to the Government for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the Government improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.

(h) *Warranty.* The Contractor warrants and implies that the items delivered hereunder are merchantable and fit for use for the particular purpose described in this contract.

(End of clause)
