Agreement (04/01-07/01/2024)

This purchase is for a maintenance contract for the BD FACSymphony A5 Flow Cytometer, that is used daily in the NCI CCR Vaccine Branch flow cytometry core facility of building 41. Contractor shall provide all labor, material and equipment required to maintain and provide preventive maintenance for a government-owned Becton Dickinson BD FACSymphony A5 Flow Cytometer, Coherent G4 UV laser, Coherent Sapphire Green Laser, Coherent Sapphire Blue Laser, Coherent MPB Red Laser and Coherent OBIS Violet Laser for the period 01 April 2024 through 01 July 2024. All maintenance service shall be performed on-site in accordance with the manufacturer's standard commercial maintenance practices.

The BD FACSymphony A5 flow cytometer Serial # H66096400111 allows the NCI to have a Core instrument with a configuration that is compatible to the customized instruments in the Vaccine Research Center. This instrument is capable of analyzing samples with 30 parameters. This instrument is in the NCI Vaccine Branch Flow Cytometry Core.

This contract will provide service and maintenance on this instrument following the initial warranty period. BD Biosciences is the only manufacturer of the FACSymphony A5 flow cytometer. There are currently six BD service engineers assigned to the NIH campus. They will respond to a service call within 24 hours and provide service to the instrument and all accessories. No other repair service has access to the proprietary parts that BD uses on its instruments, or the ability to respond to a service call within 24 hours. This instrument is used daily in the Vaccine Branch FACS Core facility to analyze samples from various animal vaccine studies. It cannot be out of service for any length of time. In order to keep this instrument fully functional a service contract with BD Biosciences is necessary.

#### **Sole Source Justification:**

BD Biosciences is the only manufacturer of the 4 FACSymphony A5 flow cytometer. There are currently six BD service engineers assigned to the NIH campus. They will respond to a service call within 24 hours and provide service to the instrument and all accessories. No other repair service has access to the proprietary parts that BD uses on its instruments, or the ability to respond to a service call within 24 hours. This instrument is used daily in the Vaccine Branch FACS Core facility to analyze samples from various animal vaccine studies. It cannot be out of service for any length of time. In order to keep this instrument fully functional a service contract with BD Biosciences is necessary.

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#### 1.0 TITLE

Maintenance Contract for BD FACSymphony A5 Flow Cytometer, Serial # H66096400111

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND

In 2007, approval was given for the creation of a new NCI CCR Vaccine Branch flow cytometry core facility in Bldg 41. This facility was created to fulfill an unmet need on the NCI Bethesda campus for a Core facility with the BL2/BL3 containment necessary to safely sort live cells infected with retroviruses, such as HIV/SIV, and other infectious agents known or suspected in blood and tissue samples. Renovations on the space for the new flow cytometry core facility began in Fall 2007 and were completed in June, 2008. Katherine McKinnon was hired in January 2008 as the new Facility Head (Staff Scientist) to set up and run the new core facility. The facility became operational on July 1, 2008.

The Core supports multiple flow cytometry applications including: cell sorting (HIV, SIV), multi-color immunophenotyping, cell cycle analysis, proliferation analysis (Ki67, PCNA, BrdU, CFSE), apoptosis measurement (Annexin V, JC1, Active Caspase 3, TUNEL), intracellular cytokine analysis, stem cell analysis, calcium flux, bead array analysis of soluble proteins, phosphorylated protein analysis, fluorescent protein analysis and sorting, and quantitative flow cytometry.

The Core Facility provides instrument and software training, and technical expertise, including assay development and experimental design for all users. The Facility Manager provides sample preparation protocols and reagent recommendations for all users including flurochrome panel setups for each flow cytometer and reagent cross-reactivity among species. The Facility Manager provides assistance with data analysis and figure preparation for presentation of flow cytometry data in publications. The Facility Manager also maintains shared Microsoft Outlook calendars that are utilized by all users to schedule time on the instruments.

The Core currently has four flow cytometry analyzers, two flow cytometry cell sorters and one magnetic bead sorter (Miltenyi AutoMACS Pro). The four flow cytometry analyzers include 3 twenty-eight color, five laser BD Biosciences FACSymphony A5 analyzers and 1 Cytek Aurora Spectral analyzer. The cell sorters are 1 fifteen color, four laser BD Biosciences FACSAria III and 1twelve-color, 4 Sony MA900 cell sorter.

The Core supports translational studies related to HIV, SIV and cancer, and basic areas of research such as HIV and HTLV-1 pathogenesis, mechanisms of translocations and alternative splicing in cancer, and functional outcomes of receptor-ligand interactions. The Core also provides research support for projects with an excellent track record in prophylactic and therapeutic vaccine design for HIV, and for other vaccine development projects on Hepatitis C, malaria, and HTLV; use of cytokines as adjuvants; ongoing research in the development of recombinant vectors and novel immunogens, such as adenoviral and HTLV-II based vectors for the delivery of HIV vaccines; and combination vaccine strategies.

#### 2.1 OBJECTIVE

This purchase is for a maintenance contract for the BD FACSymphony A5 Flow Cytometer, Serial # H66096400111 that is used daily in the core facility.

#### 3.0 SCOPE

Contractor shall provide all labor, material and equipment required to maintain and provide preventive maintenance for a government-owned Becton Dickinson BD FACSymphony A5 Flow Cytometer, Serial # H66096400111, Coherent G4 UV laser, Coherent Sapphire Green Laser, Coherent Sapphire Blue Laser, Coherent MPB Red Laser and Coherent OBIS Violet Laser for the period 01 April 2024 through 01 July 2024. All maintenance service shall be performed on-site in accordance with the manufacturer's standard commercial maintenance practices.

#### 4.0 CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS/ AND PERSONNEL QUALIFICATIONS

- 4.1 <u>PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE:</u> Contractor shall perform one (1) preventive maintenance inspections (PMI) during the contract period. Technically qualified factory-trained personnel shall perform Service. Service shall consist of a thorough cleaning, calibration, adjusting, inspection, lubrication and testing of all equipment in accordance with the manufacturer's latest established service procedures. All equipment shall be operationally tested through at least one (1) complete operating cycle at the end of the preventive maintenance inspection to assure optimum and efficient performance.
- 4.2 <u>EMERGENCY SERVICE</u>: One on-site, emergency repair service visit shall be provided during the term of this contract at no additional cost to the government. Emergency service shall be provided during normal working hours, Monday through Friday excluding Federal Holidays. Upon receipt of notice that any part of the equipment is not functioning properly the Contractor shall within twenty-four (24) hours furnish a qualified factory-trained service representative to inspect the equipment and perform all repairs and adjustments necessary to restore the equipment to normal and efficient operating condition. Emergency service calls shall not replace the necessity for scheduled PMIs. The contractor shall provide unlimited technical support hot-line number for telephone trouble-shooting for the instrument, reagents and applications during normal working hours, except Federal holidays.
- 4.3 <u>REPLACEMENT PARTS</u>: The contractor shall furnish all required replacement parts at no additional cost to the Government, with the exception of consumables. Parts shall be new or re-manufactured to original equipment specifications.

- 4.4 <u>SOFTWARE UPDATES/SERVICE</u>: The contractor shall provide Software Service and updates in accordance with the manufacturer's latest established service procedures, to include telephone access to technical support for use of program software and trouble-shooting of the operating systems, at no additional cost to the Government. The contractor shall receive advance approval for the installation of all software updates and revisions from the Government. Defective software shall be replaced at no additional cost to the government.
- 4.5 <u>PERSONNEL QUALIFICATIONS:</u> Personnel shall have a minimum of three (3) years factory training and experience in the servicing of the Becton Dickinson FACSymphony, HTS, Coherent G4 UV laser, Coherent Sapphire Green Laser, Coherent Sapphire Blue Laser, Coherent MPB Red Laser and Coherent OBIS Violet Laser as covered by this contract. All primary service personnel shall have at least one backup support person with at least the same level of expertise on the equipment covered by this contract.
- 4.6 <u>SERVICE EXCLUSIONS</u>: The contractor shall not be responsible for any repairs necessitated by abuse, neglect, vandalism, Acts of God, fire or water. These repairs shall be the subject of a separate purchase order and shall not be performed under this contract.

#### 5.0 TYPE OF ORDER

This is a firm fixed price purchase order.

#### 6.0 PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

Period of Performance shall be for three (3) months from 01 April 2024 through 01 July 2024.

#### 9.0 PAYMENT

Payment shall be made <u>quarterly in arrears</u>. Payment authorization requires submission and approval of invoices to the COR and NIH OFM, in accordance with the attached payment provisions listed below:

#### II. INVOICE PAYMENT

- A. Except as indicated in paragraph B., below, the due date for making invoice payments by the designated payment office shall be the later of the following two events:
  - 1. The 30th day after the designated billing office has received a proper invoice.
  - 2. The 30th day after Government acceptance of supplies delivered or services performed.

- (d) *Inspection/Acceptance*. The Contractor shall tender for acceptance only those items that conform to the requirements of this contract. The Government reserves the right to inspect or test any supplies or services that have been tendered for acceptance. The Government may require repair or replacement of nonconforming supplies or reperformance of nonconforming services at no increase in contract price. The Government must exercise its postacceptance rights-
- (1) Within a reasonable period of time after the defect was discovered or should have been discovered; and
- (2) Before any substantial change occurs in the condition of the item, unless the change is due to the defect in the item.
- (e) Excusable delays. The Contractor shall be liable for default unless nonperformance is caused by an occurrence beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor and without its fault or negligence, such as acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, unusually severe weather, and delays of common carriers. The Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing as soon as it is reasonably possible after the commencement of any excusable delay, setting forth the full particulars in connection therewith, shall remedy such occurrence with all reasonable dispatch, and shall promptly give written notice to the Contracting Officer of the cessation of such occurrence.
- (f) Termination for the Government's convenience. The Government reserves the right to terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for its sole convenience. In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall immediately stop all work hereunder and shall immediately cause any and all of its suppliers and subcontractors to cease work. Subject to the terms of this contract, the Contractor shall be paid a percentage of the contract price reflecting the percentage of the work performed prior to the notice of termination, plus reasonable charges that the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government, using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred that reasonably could have been avoided.
- (g) Termination for cause. The Government may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the Contractor, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the Government, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the Government shall not be liable to the Contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the Contractor shall be liable to the Government for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the Government improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.
- (h) *Warranty*. The Contractor warrants and implies that the items delivered hereunder are merchantable and fit for use for the particular purpose described in this contract.

# Prescription As prescribed in 4.2105(a), the contracting officer shall insert the provision at 52.204-24, Representation Regarding Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services or Equipment— (1) In all solicitations for contracts; and (2) Under indefinite delivery contracts, in all notices of intent to place an order, or solicitations for an order ( e.g. , subpart 8.4 and 16.505).

Full Text

#### Representation Regarding Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services or Equipment

The Offeror shall not complete the representation in this provision if the Offeror has represented that it "does not provide covered telecommunications equipment or services as a part of its offered products or services to the Government in the performance of any contract, subcontract, or other contractual instrument" in the provision at 52.204-26, Covered Telecommunications Equipment or Services-Representation, or in paragraph (v) of the provision at 52.212-3, Offeror Representations and Certifications-Commercial Items.

(a) Definitions. As used in this provision—

"Covered telecommunications equipment or services", "critical technology", and "substantial or essential component" have the meanings provided in clause 52.204-25, Prohibition on Contracting for Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services or Equipment.

- (b) *Prohibition*. Section 889(a)(1)(A) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (Pub. L. 115-232) prohibits the head of an executive agency on or after August 13, 2019, from procuring or obtaining, or extending or renewing a contract to procure or obtain, any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. Contractors are not prohibited from providing—
- (1) A service that connects to the facilities of a third-party, such as backhaul, roaming, or interconnection arrangements; or
- (2) Telecommunications equipment that cannot route or redirect user data traffic or permit visibility into any user data or packets that such equipment transmits or otherwise handles.
- (c) *Procedures*. The Offeror shall review the list of excluded parties in the System for Award Management (SAM) (https://www.sam.gov) for entities excluded from receiving federal awards for "covered telecommunications

telecommunications equipment or services", the Offeror shall provide the following information as part of the offer—

- (1) A description of all covered telecommunications equipment and services offered (include brand; model number, such as original equipment manufacturer (OEM) number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number; and item description, as applicable);
- (2) Explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications equipment and services and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b) of this provision;
- (3) For services, the entity providing the covered telecommunications services (include entity name, unique entity identifier, and Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) code, if known); and
- (4) For equipment, the entity that produced the covered telecommunications equipment (include entity name, unique entity identifier, CAGE code, and whether the entity was the OEM or a distributor, if known).

#### Subcontractor Flow Down Text

While the provision doesn't include an explicit flowdown requirement, it does require the offeror to certify that it will not provide covered telecommunications equipment or services as a part of its offered products or services to the Government in the performance of any contract, subcontract, or other contractual instrument.
