


Budget Appropriation Phases - FY2020





FY18 NCI Appropriation: \$5.9 Billion


Budget Allocation FY18 <u>RPG</u> Analogy (Same general process for any sub-component of the budget)

BUDGET (Salary)	\$2,276M
SMALL BUSINESS SET ASIDE (Taxes)	- \$139M
NON-COMPETING COMMITMENTS (Mortgage)	- \$1,626M
COMPETING AVAILABILITY	\$511M
RFA "RESERVE" (Groceries)	<u>- \$51M</u>
REMAINING FOR R01,P01, etc. (Tuition, Retirement)	\$460M

Note: Non-competing is over 70% of Budget



The Funding Policy Rubik's Cube

Funding Selection Process How are individual grants selected?

- Paylines/Fundable Ranges (over 70% of unsolicited RPGs in FY18)
 - Percentile or Impact Scores within which applications will likely be funded with minimal review
 - RPG Mechanisms with fundable ranges: R01, R21, R03, R15
- Scientific Program Leaders (SPL) Selections
 - P01, U01, Large R01, RFA
 - Other non-percentiled applications
- Division Allocations
 - Applications outside paylines
 - Administrative supplements
- Selection Considerations
 - Peer review
 - Filling gaps in cancer research portfolio
 - Especially novel or promising scientific approach
