Budget Appropriation: Three Phases

FY18 target date examples listed; actual dates will vary based on timing of budget deliberations and in Presidential transition years.

Formulation: Examine scientific and budget priorities to develop President's Budget (PB) submission for the Office of Management and Budget

March 2016 – January 2017



Presentation: Defend budget request at Congressional hearings (Congressional Justification); Funds appropriated

February 2017 – September 2017



Execution: Funds distributed to NCI Divisions, Offices, & Centers (DOCs)... **OBLIGATE FUNDS!!**

October 2017 – September 2018

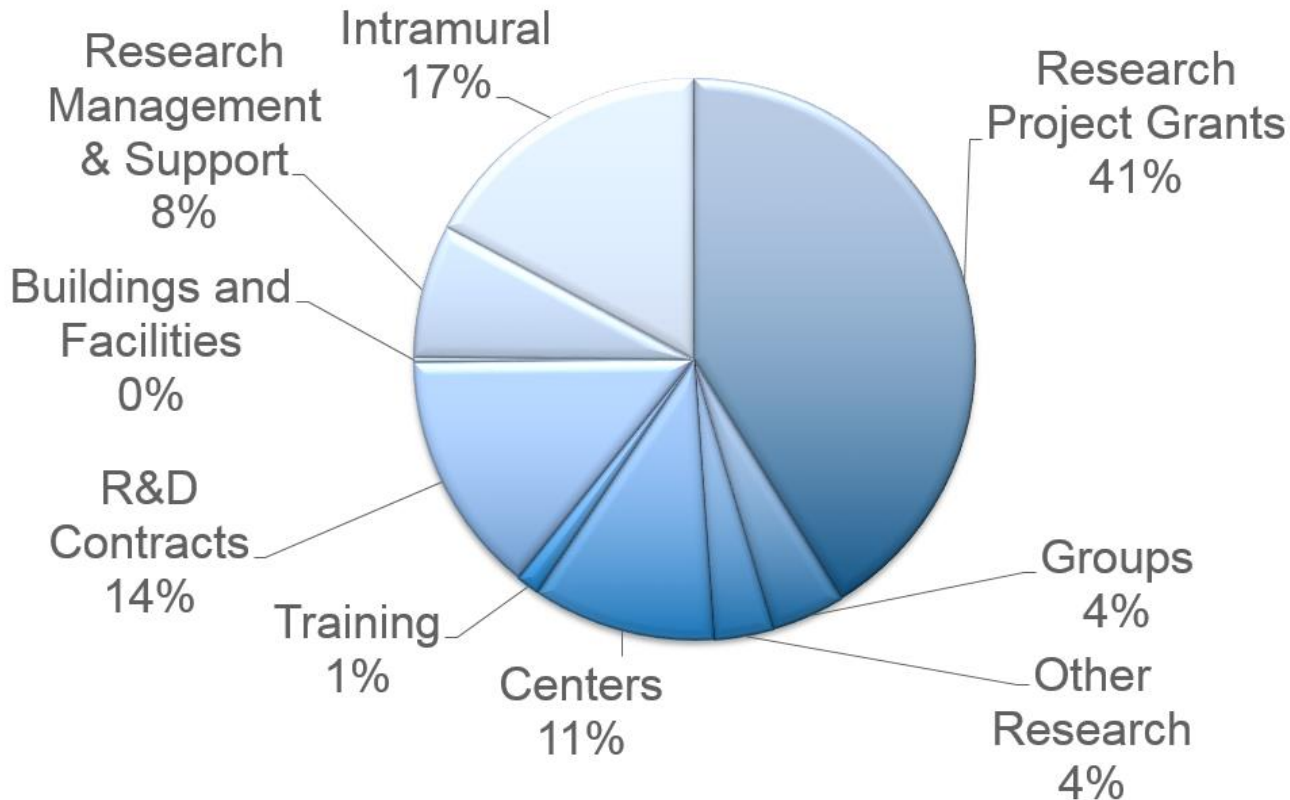


Formulation through Execution = approx. 2 ½ years

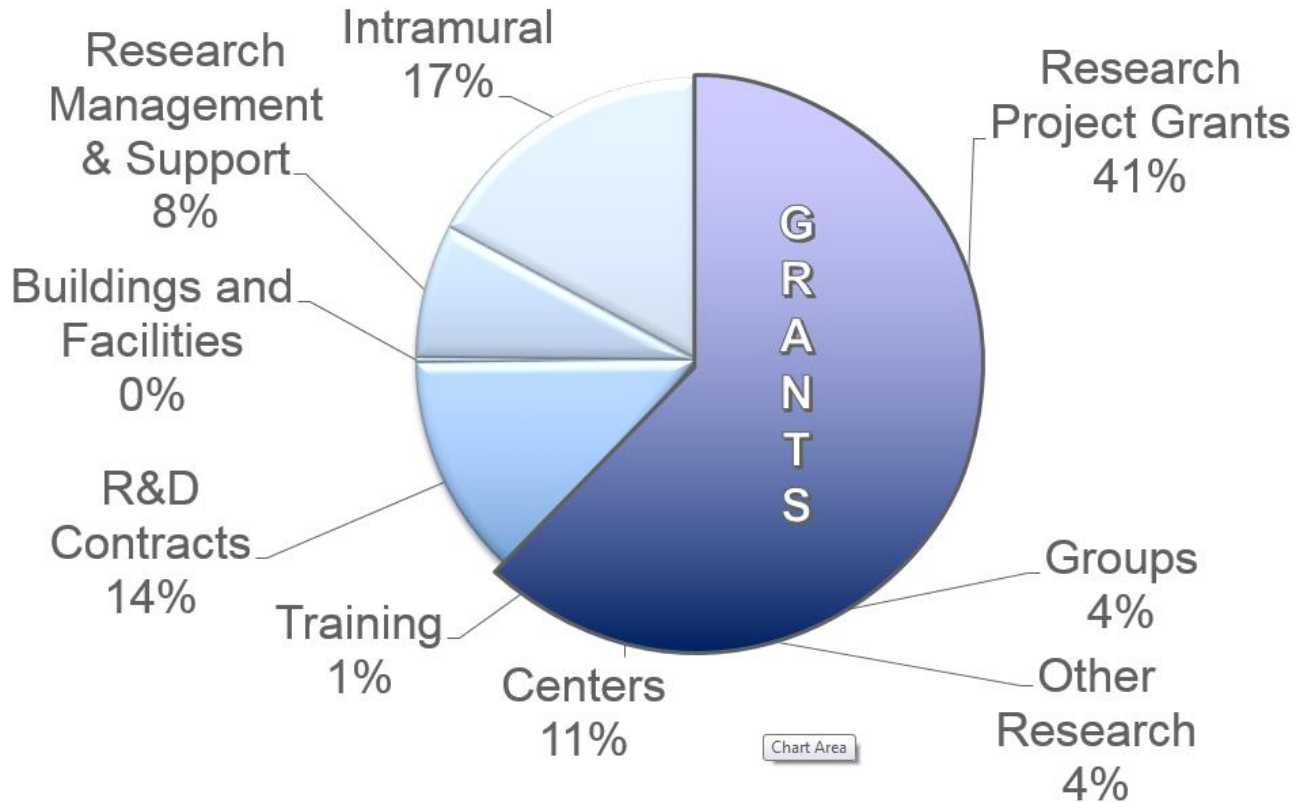

Grants Budget Allocation

FY16 RPG Allocation Analogy

Budget (Your salary)	\$2,068M
Subtract what you “have to” do...	
- SBIR/STTR mandate (Taxes)	- \$101M
- Non-Competing (Mortgage)	- \$1,454M
Funds for Competing (Flexible spending)	\$513M
- RFA “Reserve” (Groceries)	- \$70M
Funds for other initiatives (Plays, Vacation)	\$443M

Grants Budget Allocation

FY16 RPG Allocation Analogy

Budget (Your salary)

\$2,068M

Subtract what you “have to” do...

- SBIR/STTR mandate (Taxes)

- Non-Competing (Agency)

-\$1,454M

Funds for competing (Flexible spending)

\$513M

“Reserve” (Groceries)

-\$70M

Funds for other initiatives (Plays, Vacation)

\$443M

Same general process for any component of the grants budget

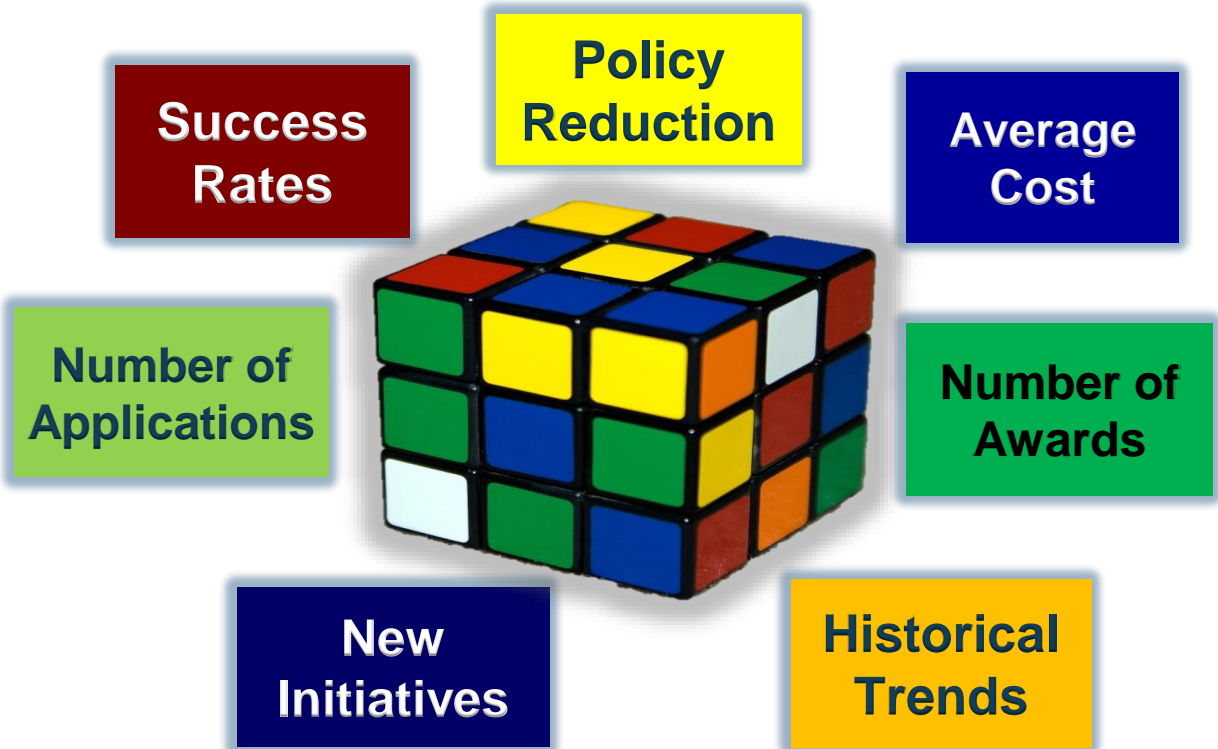

Funding Selection Process

Once we have the money, how are grants selected?

▪ Paylines/Fundable Ranges

- Percentile or Impact Scores within which applications will likely be funded with minimal review
- RPG Mechanisms with fundable ranges: R01, R21, R03, R15

▪ Scientific Program Leaders (SPL) Selections

- P01, U01, Large R01, RFA
- Other non-percentiled applications

▪ Division Allocations

- Applications outside paylines
- Administrative supplements

▪ Selection Considerations

- Peer review
- Filling gaps in cancer research portfolio
- Especially novel or promising scientific approach
