CCDI: Sharing Data to Accelerate Progress in Cancer Research and Care

The National Cancer Institute's **Childhood Cancer Data Initiative (CCDI)** is engaging the childhood cancer research, care, and advocacy community to harness and share data in transformative ways.

BUILDING A DATA INFRASTRUCTURE

CCDI is making it easier for researchers and oncology teams to learn from every young person with cancer. The core of its data infrastructure is the **CCDI Data Ecosystem**, complete with user-friendly tools and platforms for finding, accessing, and analyzing childhood cancer data from NCI and other institutions.

The **CCDI Hub** is the Data Ecosystem's entry point, where users can access its data and resources, such as the:

- Childhood Cancer Clinical Data Commons, a database with harmonized childhood cancer demographics and phenotypic clinical data.
- **Childhood Cancer Data Catalog**, a searchable inventory of childhood cancer resources.
- **Molecular Targets Platform**, a tool with information about molecules that affect the growth and spread of childhood cancers.
- NCCR Data Platform, a web app that allows users to visualize childhood cancer statistics in a secure cloud system.
- **NCCR*Explorer**, a rapidly growing tool with statistics related to cancers in children, adolescents, and young adults (AYAs).

WIDENING ACCESS TO MOLECULAR TESTING

The **CCDI Molecular Characterization Initiative** is a national collaboration that provides free, state-of-the-art molecular testing to children and AYAs with certain rare or hard-to-treat cancers. Results help inform treatment decisions, including clinical trial participation. Data from these results are made available to researchers for future studies.

EVOLVING TO MEET COMMUNITY NEEDS
